Health and Safety



During drop off and collection times, we kindly ask parents/carers to drop off/pick up at the outer gates at the turning point between Loch PS and St. Anthony's PS. No parents/carers should access the playground between both schools. To avoid congestion at the school gates, we continue to kindly ask that only one parent/carer drops off and collects your child and that once your child enters/leaves the school you leave the area immediately to avoid overcrowding before St. Anthony's PS exit.

Attendance and Time-Keeping



Attendance at school is crucial to support children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Please remember that should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 or via the school app and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. In accordance with SLC Policy we must contact parents/carers if we have not been informed of a reason for a pupil being absent from nursery or school.

It is equally important that each pupil arrives at the school in time for the bell to ring at their allocated start time. We understand that everyone can, on occasion, sleep in and run late for school for many reasons, however regular lateness can be very disruptive to your child's education.

Please remember that your child will be marked as 'unauthorised' should they go on holiday during term time.

As we have children in the nursery and school with severe allergies, please remember that Loch Primary School and Nursery Class is a 'NUT FREE' school. Please keep this in mind when you are sending your child to school with a snack/packed lunch. Should your child bring a snack with nuts in it, the Class Teacher/Nursery staff will keep it until the end of the day and return it for your child to eat at home. - Our HMIE inspection took place w/c 5th
 September. We will share the report with everyone as soon as it becomes available.
- Miss Simpson attended the Inclusion Conference within South Lanarkshire Council which focussed on the theme "Nurturing Mental Health: The Power of Positive Relationships".
- Miss Harrington attended the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Lead Network Session which focussed on the use of micro:bits within classes. This was shared with staff during our staff meeting so that these can be used in class to promote challenge and enjoyment.
- Our Scottish Attainment Challenge end of year report was completed and submitted to SLC, detailing our progress in terms of our Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing priorities.
- Miss Harrington participated in ICT
 Coordinator training to learn how to manage
 Chromebook usage within the school.
- Mrs Barrett attended the Literacy Coordinators' Meeting to keep up-to-date on new initiatives.
- Mrs Roy, Mrs Burns, Mrs Munro and Mrs Henderson took part in the Learning Community Play Network meeting.

The chosen item with the most votes was to fund trips and events for all pupils. We will now work towards achieving this aim, consulting and keeping everyone up-to-date with our progress.
