#### Health and Safety



As we have children in the nursery and school with severe allergies, please remember that Loch Primary School and Nursery Class is a 'NUT FREE' school. Please keep this in mind when you are sending your child to school with a snack/packed lunch. Should your child bring a snack with nuts in it, the Class Teacher/Nursery staff will keep it until the end of the day and return it for your child to eat at home. Thank you to everyone for your help and support with this matter.

As you will be aware, headlice can cause problems both at home and in school. Please try to check your child's hair regularly and if you see any headlice, it is recommended that you treat both them and the whole family.

#### Attendance and Time-Keeping



Attendance at school is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 or via the school app and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. In accordance with SLC Policy we must contact parents/carers if we have not been informed of a reason for a pupil being absent from nursery or school. It is equally important that each pupil arrives at the school in time for the bell to ring at their allocated start time. We understand that everyone can, on occasion, sleep in and run late for school for many reasons, however regular lateness can be very disruptive to your child's education.

## School Improvement/PEF Update

- Miss Simpson attended 'Attendance Test of Change' training to support our work in improving attendance across the school.
- Mrs Peters attended accredited Nurture UK training to support the development of our nurture work within the school.
- Miss Harrington has met with all teaching staff to discuss the progress of all children and supports available within the school.
- Miss Harrington attended the ICT
  Coordinators Meeting to learn about the latest
  updates from SLC.
- All staff received training from Susan Tullett (Nurture Lead Officer in SLC) to support the development of our nurture work and the review of our 'Promoting Positive Relationships Policy'.

#### Participatory Budgeting -

• We have now consulted all stakeholders including pupils, parents/carers and staff on how we should spend 5% of our PEF budget. The chosen item with the most votes was to fund trips and events for all pupils. This work is already underway and we will continue to keep everyone up-to-date with our progress. #### Nurture Focus Week NURTURING



This month all pupils from Nursery to Primary 7 enjoyed participating in our annual Nurture Focus Week. This special week allowed the children to fully focus on our nurturing approaches and develop their understanding of the 'Six Principles of Nurture':

- Children's learning is understood developmentally - "We all learn in different
- The classroom offers a safe base "The classroom is a safe place"
- The importance of nurture for the development of wellbeing - "Nurture helps us feel good in our mind and body"
- Language is a vital means of communication - "The way we speak and the words we use are important"
- All behaviour is communication "How we behave tells you how we feel"
- The importance of transition in children's lives - "Everyone faces change and Nurture can help"

Activities included 'Sunshine Room' sessions, input on 'Attachment' from our Educational Psychologist, mindfulness activities, 'Positive Me' activities encouraging positive thinking, 'How to be a good friend' activities and a range of tasks to support positive wellbeing. This was a very successful week which was greatly enjoyed by all!

### Primary 1-7 Book of the Term



Each term your child will receive a 'Book of the Term' for them to keep at home. This book will be free as we will be using our Pupil Equity Funding to support the development of reading and to help us promote reading for enjoyment. Each class teacher has chosen three books which will be issued to your child throughout the session. The first book was issued on 27.10.23. We kindly ask that you encourage your child to participate in this project and to read their book at home. Class Teachers may also provide homework tasks linked to each book.
