### Health and Safety

#### Attendance and Time-Keeping

Attendance at school is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 or via the school app and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. In accordance with SLC Policy we must contact parents/carers if we have not been informed of a reason for a child being absent from nursery or school. It is equally important that each child arrives at the school in time for the bell to ring at their allocated start time. We understand that everyone can, on occasion, sleep in and run late for school for many reasons, however regular lateness can be very disruptive to your child's education.

### School Improvement/PEF Update

- Mrs McKee has attended 'Bookbug' and 'Pondering Pedagogy' training to further develop our practice within the nursery.
- Mrs Barrett attended the second session of 'Kindergarten Skills' training to enhance our Outdoor Learning provision within the nursery.
- Mrs Munro participated in the final session of 'Maths Recovery' training to support the implementation of this approach in Primary 1.
- Miss Harrington participated in the 'Inclusive Education Showcase' to ensure resources used across the curriculum are inclusive to all.
- Miss Simpson attended 'Attendance Test of Change' training to support our work in improving attendance across the school.
- During the inservice day on 13.11.23, all primary staff participated in the review of our 'Promoting Positive Relationships Policy' as well as the creation of our 'Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics' (STEM) and Science progression planners. Our Early Years staff also participated in an Early Learning and Childcare practitioner event based on 'Sustainability and Biodiversity'.
- Our nursery staff participated in the second session of the 'Together We Count' training, to support the development of Numeracy within the nursery environment.
- Miss Simpson attended 'Nursery Curriculum' training to share practice and develop further ideas of how we can plan and extend children's learning throughout the curriculum.

- Miss Simpson has met with all nursery staff to discuss the progress of all children and supports available within the nursery.
- Mrs Smith attended 'Talk for Writing' training to support the implementation of this writing approach in Primary 7.
- Miss Harrington attended the 'ICT Coordinators' Meeting' to keep up-to-date with the latest updates from South Lanarkshire Council.
- Miss Simpson and Miss Harrington attended 'Analysis Tool' training, looking at a new resource to track and monitor the progress and achievement of all learners.

## Nursery Update

This month the children have been busy focusing on our 'Book of the Month', "Goldilocks and the Three Bears", and our 'Rhyme of the Month', "Hickory Dickory Dock". We have been exploring the story and rhyme through the use of puppets, role play and writing our own stories. Our rhyme has led to lots of activities related to the concept of time. The children have enjoyed participating in number hunts within the school, school grounds and in the community. The book "The Stickman" has also proven very popular this month with the children enjoying creating lots of artwork to decorate our nursery. During Outdoor Learning, the children have been exploring and developing their problem-solving skills through using the water trays, channels and pumps to discover how water flows.

We would like to thank everyone who has attended our PEEP sessions this month. It has been great to see so many of you participating in these sessions and we hope you have found them useful and informative! On Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December, we will be holding a Bookbug gifting session for our antepreschool children. Further information will be provided. If you wish to attend, we kindly ask you to add your name to the list in the cloakroom.

We are going to be busy preparing our artwork for the Christmas Café and Art Exhibition on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> December. We are sure you will be very impressed by the wonderful creations all of our artists will produce!

This month the 'Tiny Talking Team' have been discussing what songs we would like to sing at our Nativity, and we are now busy rehearsing for our show! Our Nativity will take place on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> December at 9:30am.

We have been reviewing our lunch policy and procedures in line with new guidance. If you provide your child with a packed lunch, we kindly ask you to include an icepack/cool pack within the lunch box to keep it fresh and cool. We also kindly request parents/carers to check your child's lunch to ensure there are no items containing nuts due to allergies within our school.

Our children have access to water play and outdoor play every day and often require to be changed if they get wet or muddy. We kindly ask parents/carers if possible to bring a change of clothes for your child and to store them in the drawstring bags provided on your child's peg.
