#### Health and Safety



As we have children in the nursery and school with severe allergies, please remember that <u>Loch Primary School and Nursery Class is a</u> <u>'NUT FREE' school</u>. Please keep this in mind when you are sending your child to school with a snack/packed lunch. Should your child bring a snack with nuts in it, the Class

Teacher/Nursery staff will keep it until the end of the day and return it for your child to eat at home. Thank you to everyone for your help and support with this matter.

As you will be aware, headlice can cause problems both at home and in school. Please try to check your child's hair regularly and if you see any headlice, it is recommended that you treat both them and the whole family.

#### Attendance and Time-Keeping



Attendance at school is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 or via the school app and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. In accordance with South Lanarkshire Council Policy we must contact parents/carers if we have not been informed of a reason for a child being absent from nursery or school.

It is equally important that each child arrives at the school in time for the bell to ring at their allocated start time. We understand that everyone can, on occasion, sleep in and run late for school for many reasons, however regular lateness can be very disruptive to your child's education.

#### School Improvement/PEF Update

- Miss Simpson and Mrs Munro attended an Early Level Play Showcase event to share good practice in the implementation of play approaches and transition events across nursery and Primary 1.
- Miss Simpson has met with all teaching staff and nursery staff to discuss the learning and attainment within all classes/nursery.
- Mrs Burns is currently attending a programme of training based on 'Introduction to Counselling Skills' to support our nurture work within the school.
- Miss Simpson attended the Head Teacher's Digital Event, looking at new digital developments within South Lanarkshire Council (SLC).
- Miss Simpson is participating in the SLC 'Early Years' Learner Pathways Working Party', working with colleagues from across SLC to plan training opportunities for staff.
- During our inservice day, staff received input from Susan Tullett (SLC Nurture Development Officer) to support the review of our 'Promoting Positive Relationships Policy'. Staff also engaged in 'Rights Respecting Schools' training, looking at how we can further develop our RRS work within the school and nursery.
- Miss Simpson and Miss Harrington have been participating in Learning Conversations this month with Primary 3/4 and Primary 6 pupils who have been keen to share their learning in class.
- The teaching staff have continued participating in the 'Limitless Learn' training programme, looking at the development of Growth Mindsets and supporting/challenging children's learning within the classroom.
- Miss Simpson attended the 'Early Level and Childcare Tracking Relaunch' looking at a new tool to support the tracking and monitoring of children's learning within the nursery environment.

- Miss Stewart attended the Numeracy Coordinator's Meeting, looking at new approaches and resources to support the teaching and assessment of Numeracy.
- Mrs Burns and Mrs Main attended the SLC Attachment Leads Meeting, looking at the process to follow to gain Attachment Accreditation.
- Mrs McKee has attended the third session of 'Pondering Pedagogy' training to further develop our practice within the nursery.
- Mrs Thomson attended 'Skills Framework' training to look at this new resource and how this can support the development of skills at Loch PS and Nursery Class.
- Mairead Maxwell, our ELC Locality Manager, visited our nursery to discuss our progress and see the great learning experiences taking place.
- Miss Simpson attended the 'ELC Conference' to keep up-to-date with the latest developments within Early Years.
- Mrs Campbell participated in the final session of 'Maths Recovery' training to support the implementation of this approach in Primary 2.

February has been another fun month within our nursery! This month our 'Rhyme of the Month' has been 'I'm a Little Teapot' and our 'Book of the Month' has been 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We hope you are enjoying the suggested activities at home! Please remember to return the bag to nursery after your allocated time to allow all children to be able to experience these activities at home.

The children have been enjoying lots of activities related to the 'Rhyme and Book of the Month' and have particularly enjoyed a visit from the 'bear' at our two 'Stay and Play' sessions this month. We would like to say a big 'thank you' to everyone who was able to attend these sessions. We hope you enjoyed seeing your child within the nursery environment. The children were delighted to show everyone their favourite activities! This month the 'Tiny Talking Team' have been continuing to discuss Children's Rights. Our 'Right of the Month' for February has been Article 31 – 'you have the right to play and rest'.

We are looking forward to 'World Book Day' on 7.3.24 where we will be exploring the children's favourite books. The children have enjoyed small group weekly 'Bookbug' sessions with Mrs McKee and we are planning a further 'Bookbug' session with parents/carers to celebrate 'World Book Day'. As part of our drive to encourage recycling and sustainability, we now have our pre-loved clothing rail set up in our nursery cloakroom.
