Health and Safety

As we are currently in tier 4 it is extremely important that we work together to continue to ensure the health and safety of all pupils, staff and parents/carers. We must continue to work together and follow all of the NHS Guidelines. To minimise large groups and to ensure social distancing measures are in place, we kindly ask that when you are dropping off/picking up your child, you leave the school grounds immediately when your child has entered/left the entrance gate to minimise overcrowding. We also kindly ask that you observe the 2-metre social distancing Scottish Government guidelines from other households when waiting at the gates. In line with the Scottish Government advice, face coverings should now be worn by parents/carers and other visitors to the school, including at drop-off and pick up times. Please ensure you wear a face covering when entering the school grounds or when waiting for your child at the gate or nursery entrance, unless you are exempt. If you wish to speak to a member of staff please do not approach them at the gate and instead contact the school office and we will get back to you as soon as possible. If your child or a member of the household displays any symptoms, we ask that you follow

the guidelines and self-isolate until test results are received. Please do not bring your child to school/Nursery with any symptoms and ensure you keep the school informed of any symptoms, tests and results.

SIP/SAC/PEF Update

- All staff participated in moderation meetings to discuss continuity and progression across all classes.
- Mrs Henderson and Miss Motherwell attended Nurture Group Accredited Training.
- Miss Harrington participated in an ICT online meeting to discuss our work within the school along with new initiatives being launched by SLC.

- Miss Simpson participated in the Nursery Head Teachers' Meeting to discuss new initiatives and work within Early Years.
- Fiona Bartholomew (Barnardo's) and Lucy Corbishley (Place2Be) continue to work within the school, supporting identified children and families.

Continuity of Learning

As part of our 'Continuity of Learning' policy, you will have received 'readiness to learn from home' leaflets in case of any closures or for any instances where a class may have to self-isolate. This leaflet will provide you with details on how your child should access Google Classrooms, including the time for registration and the times when your child's class teacher will be available. We hope this plan will never need to be used but we kindly ask that you store this leaflet with your pack we provided last month in a safe place in case it is required.

Any child who is self-isolating will be provided with work via Google Classrooms. It is important that they continue to complete their work at home in order to ensure their learning is not disrupted. If you are experiencing any difficulty accessing this online platform, please do not hesitate to contact us and we will be happy to help.

Attendance



It is important that everyone continues to make a great effort to come to school on a regular basis. Please remember that should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 or via the school app and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. In accordance with SLC Policy we must contact parents/carers if we have not been informed of a reason for a pupil being absent from Nursery or School. This procedure is to ensure each one of our pupils is safe.

Committees

All children participated in their second Committee afternoon on 25.11.20, completing allocated activities from their chosen committee:

The **Pupil Council** have been thinking about ways to continue to embed the 'Loch Pupil Friendly Nurture Principles' across the school. They decided to focus on designing a logo to represent each principle. The chosen design will be displayed alongside our Nurture posters throughout the school. This month the focus was on designing a logo for "We all learn in different ways".

The **Social Enterprise Committee** have been busy creating questions for the 'class interviews' section of the school newspaper. They have also been creating their school display, designing an individual mug to show they are part of the committee.

The **Charity Committee** are currently promoting our next charity event which is 'Christmas Jumper Day' to raise money for 'Save the Children'. The committee hopes everyone can join in on Friday 11th December and wear your Christmas jumper to school. Donations can be made via Parent Pay.

The Rights Respecting Schools Committee have been updating the school's right cards, discussing what a right means and then illustrating what the right looks like and means to them.

The Health and Eco Committee have been looking at the school's Eco Action Plan and suggesting ways to address the areas selected including tackling litter, reducing our landfill waste and encouraging more diverse wildlife into our playground.

The P1-4 pupils in the **Sports Council** have been busy designing a rugby ball to show who represents the Sports Council, and what their favourite sport is. The P5-7 pupils have been focusing on identifying the variety of transferable skills we use and are able to develop within sports. The children have successfully identified a range of skills and illustrated how these are furthered through regular engagement with sporting activities.

Nursery Update

The groups have also been exploring stories including the "Three Little Pigs" and "Goldilocks and the Three Bears". During Science Week, the children enjoyed completing experiments and exploring forces.

As part of our 'Promoting Positive Relationships Policy', we have implemented the 'Bucket Filling' strategy within the Nursery. For this, all children have the opportunity to earn and collect pompoms or gems for their team bucket. Children can win a pompom or gem by being kind, helpful and caring. The concept of 'bucket filling' is based upon the book "Are You a Bucket Filler?" by Carol McCloud.

We kindly ask that all parents/carers provide more than one change of clothes for their child to allow for changes to be made when necessary or if the children get wet or muddy during outdoor and water play.

Due to current circumstances we kindly request that all parents/carers continue to follow the 2-metre social distancing guidelines from staff and other families at drop-off and collection times.
