Health and Safety

As we have children in the nursery and school who have severe allergies, please remember that Loch Primary School and Nursery Class is a 'NUT FREE' school. Please keep this in mind when you are sending your child to school with a snack. Should your child bring a snack with nuts in it, the Class Teacher/Nursery staff will keep it until the end of the day and return it for your child to eat at home. Thank you to everyone for your help and support.

Attendance and Time-Keeping



Once again we continue to aim to achieve our attendance target of 95% this session. It is important that everyone continues to make a great effort to come to school on a regular basis. Please remember that should your child be unwell it is important that you contact the School Office on 0141 634 7217 and leave a message stating the cause of absence and possible date of return. The School Office will be open daily from 8.00am. In accordance with SLC Policy we require to telephone parents if we have not been informed of a reason for a pupil being absent from nursery or school. This procedure is to ensure each one of our pupils is safe.

It is equally important that each pupil arrives at the school in time for the bell to ring at 9.00am. We understand that everyone can, on occasions, sleep in and run late for school for many reasons, however regular lateness can be very disruptive to the child's education. Please remember that your child will be marked as 'unauthorised' should they go on holiday during term time. Any work that has been missed will be given on their return to school.

We will contact parents/carers if pupil attendance is becoming a concern and a meeting will be arranged within the school where required. Should there be no improvement then a further meeting will take place with Frances Swinburne, our Senior Manager Pupil Support, to provide support with school attendance.

In Loch PS we believe that it is extremely important for all children to attend school on time and on a regular basis to ensure they receive their entitlement of a full education and we will work with all of our families to achieve this.

School Uniform



It is great to see so many of our children looking very smart in their new school uniforms. Our school uniform colours are <u>navy</u> <u>blue and gold</u>. We encourage wearing school uniform as it shows a sense of pride in being part of Loch PS Community. Breakfast Club



The Breakfast Club is open from 8:15-8:45am. Children should arrive no later than 8:30am as this is when the last service for breakfast will be to allow for cleaning in preparation for the school day. Children must have a consent form, signed by their parent/carer, to allow them to attend. All other pupils should continue to arrive no earlier than 8:45am when the playground will have a staff presence and the hall will be cleared in the event of wet weather.

School Improvement



Our School Improvement Plan priorities for this session are Literacy (developing a whole school 'Talk for Writing' approach and Talking and Listening programme), Numeracy (with a focus on Mental Maths) and Health and Wellbeing (developing as a whole school Nurturing School and reviewing our HWB Curriculum). Our maintenance agenda includes promoting parental engagement; promoting leadership at all levels; encouraging pupil voice; reducing 'cost of the school day'; promoting skills for learning, life and work; continuing our implementation of 1+2 languages; promoting the use of digital technology and working towards achieving our 6th Green Eco Flag.

SAC/PEF Update

We now have a new allocated Place2Be Project Manager, Lucy Corbishley, who has started within the school every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning. Letters will be provided to parents/carers informing them about this service soon.

Fiona Bartholomew from Barnardo's will continue to work with us this session, working with targeted families and offering support to all parents/carers during 'drop-in' sessions every Thursday morning.

Nursery Update

This session our nursery is open from 9am - 4pm. Every pupil is entitled to 6 funded hours within this time slot. If you wish your child to stay for an additional hour, this will be charged at £3.20 per hour. If you wish more information on this and to receive a contract, please speak to a member of staff.

Over the summer, our nursery was extended and it is now looking fabulous! All of our returning children have settled back into the nursery routine and are helping and welcoming all of our new friends to our nursery!

Everyone is making friends and learning how to share and co-operate with each other. The pupils are also enjoying having their lunches in the school dinner hall. Our new children are learning the nursery routines of snack, hand washing, lunch routines, tooth brushing and tidy up. During gym times everyone is learning how to warm up, cool down and be safe while participating in a variety of games and healthy physical experiences. All of the children are encouraged to be independent and make choices about their learning throughout their time at nursery.
