<u>Parent Pay</u>

As of Tuesday 1.10.19, Loch PS will become a cashless school as we will now begin to use Parent Pay. Parent Pay will be used for lunches as well as events such as trips and whole school events. Please ensure you register for Parent Pay and follow the guidance on the letters provided, as we will be unable to accept cash payments for lunches from Tuesday.

School Chaplaincy Team

Our Chaplaincy Team continues this year, the same as last year, with Aquila Singh, Ross Murray and Alison Kennedy. They will provide input at assemblies throughout the year focusing on different themes through different Bible stories including: Abraham (bravely going where no one has gone before); Joseph (forgiveness); David (courage); Christmas; David (conflict); Solomon (rule like me: wisdom/justice); Esther (the Beauty Queen: I can make a difference); Peter (a big Fisherman: ordinary people/extraordinary deeds) and Moving On. All dates and themes are detailed on the school website. Ross, Alison and Aquila will also carry out various workshops including 'It's Your Move', 'Buddy Training' and 'Easter Code'. <u>School Improvement</u>

- Miss Simpson and Mrs McGuire met with Anne Jessimer (our Quality Link Lead Officer) to discuss our aims for this session within the areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing.
- Miss Simpson attended 'Talk for Writing' leadership training to find out more about the programme and how this can be implemented successfully throughout the school from Nursery to Primary 7. Mrs Campbell and Mrs Roy also attended 'Talk for Writing' training to learn more about how to implement this resource within Nursery and Primary 1/2.
- Mrs McGuire attended 'ICT Coordinators' training where she was able to hear about the new resources/programs available to use within the school.
- The children have enjoyed participating in 'Modern Languages Awareness Week' this week. They have been able to take part in a range of activities to promote their use

of the French/Spanish language as well as their understanding of the countries of France and Spain. Activities included artist studies, food tasting and Primary 5 enjoyed a French lesson from the staff and pupils at Cathkin High School.

SAC/PEF Update

- Lucy Corbishley, our Place 2 Be Lead • Councillor, has started Place 2 Talk sessions with the pupils. Please remember that parents/carers must complete permission slips to allow their child to self-refer to this service. This will be offered to children Monday - Wednesday during lunchtimes. As well as this service, there is also an opportunity for 1-1 sessions where a child can be referred by the school/parent/carer for dedicated 1-1 sessions with one of the councillors. Please speak to either Miss Simpson, Mrs McGuire or your child's class teacher if you would like to find out more about this service
- Fiona Bartholomew from Barnardo's continues to offer support to all parents/carers during 'drop-in' sessions every Thursday morning.

Committees

All children from Nursery to Primary 7 attended their first committee meeting on 18.9.19. Every child is a member of one of seven committees: Pupil Council, Enterprise, Charity, Rights Respecting Schools (RRS), Eco, Sports Council or Junior Road Safety Officers. The children enjoyed getting to know their committee and discussing what their aims will be for this session. *<u>Pupil Council</u> – discussed the 'Six Principles of Nurture' and how these should be displayed within the school.

*<u>RRS</u> - looked at ways to make the 'Children's Rights' more child-friendly. *<u>Enterprise</u> – began to plan for their first Community Café and decided on a Halloween Café (letters with more information will be issued soon).

*<u>Charity</u> - decided on what charity Loch PS will support this term and discussed ideas for how we can do this.

*<u>Eco</u> - looked at the different ways we can improve our school to help us work towards our 6th Green Flag.

*<u>Sports Council</u> - discussed how we can promote the 'Daily Mile' within the school and decided to create posters.

*<u>JRSO</u> - discussed how we can promote safe travel to school and started to create advice posters.
