- Mrs Barrett and Miss Stewart attended Literacy/Numeracy Coordinators' Meetings on 10.10.19/11.10.19 to learn more about Literacy/Numeracy developments within SLC.

- Miss Simpson attended the 'Leadership Through School Improvement Conference' on 22.10.19, looking at ways to raise attainment and achievements for all pupils as well as ways to track pupil progress.
