

Attendance and Time-Keeping



Attendance at school remains a key priority here at Loch Primary School and across the Cathkin Learning Community. Attendance is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Your child's attendance rate has a significant impact on their attainment and achievements. Did you know, within a full school year the following percentages show you the number of days lost learning:

Why is good school attendance so important?

- All children have a right to an education and the legal responsibility to provide children with an education lies with their parents/carers.
- When children are absent from school, whatever the cause, this disrupts their learning and can have a significant impact on their future life opportunities.
- In particular, poor attendance can affect attainment levels, relationships with peers, wellbeing and emotional resilience.

What parents/carers can do to support your child's school attendance?

 Promote good habits at home to encourage good attendance.

- Work in partnership with the school to support your child's attendance.
- If you are worried about your child's
 attendance at school or the school have
 contacted you to raise awareness of
 attendance concerns, contact the school
 immediately to discuss supports available.
- Early intervention is crucial, the earlier the issue is identified and positively addressed the better the longer-term outcome for the child.

Top Tips for Parents/Carers to Promote Good Attendance:

- Be on time for school, even missing 10 minutes every day adds up and can negatively impact learning.
- Always let the school know before 9.30am
 if your child won't be in and what the
 reason for the absence is.
- Keep in regular contact with the school for the duration of the absence.
- Only keep your child at home for the minimum time possible reducing the number of days of lost learning.
- Avoid booking holidays during term time.
- Have positive conversations about school with your child to encourage positive mindsets.
- Be involved in school life and your child's learning journey.

We encourage all parents/carers to monitor your child's attendance. Please log on to Parents Portal using the link www.parentsportal.scot to check your child's attendance so far this session.

January has been a busy month within our nursery! All of the children have settled back in well and we have been focusing on developing Literacy and Numeracy skills through our 'Book of the Month', "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" and our 'Rhyme of the Month', "Tiny Turtle". Through this, the children have been exploring the sequence of the story and the concepts of 'beginning, middle and end' whilst engaging in discussions and story mapping activities. The children have also enjoyed acting out parts of the story using props and masks. In Numeracy, the children have been developing their understanding of mathematical language to describe the size of items. They have enjoyed experiences to support and develop their counting on and back skills.

We have also been learning about different cultural festivals through celebrating 'Robert Burns Day' with lots of Scottish songs and Scots language stories as well as celebrating Chinese New Year. As part of our Burns celebrations in the nursery, the children enjoyed a fantastic Bookbug Session, with lots of Scottish rhymes, songs, a story and dancing! Thanks to all the families for coming along, it was a wonderful session, supporting the children's language and social development and promoting positive wellbeing for all!

To promote their wellbeing, the children have been enjoying energetic play experiences through participating in activities outdoors and in gym to develop their balance and coordination skills.

The children continue to have access to the outdoors each day. To support us with this, we kindly ask you to ensure your child is wearing appropriate clothing to enable them to stay warm and well when out in the colder weather. We also kindly ask that your child has a change of clothes available in their bag on their peg.
