Attendance and Punctuality



Attendance at school remains a key priority here at Loch Primary School and across the Cathkin Learning Community. Attendance is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Your child's attendance rate has a significant impact on their attainment and achievements. Did you know, within a full school year the following percentages show you the number of days lost learning:

95% - 99%	Up to 10 days absence (2 weeks)
90% - 94%	Up to 20 days absence (4 weeks)
85% - 89%	Up to 30 days absence (6 weeks)
80% - 84%	Up to 38 days absence $(7\frac{1}{2}$ weeks)
Less than	More than 39 days
80%	absence

Why is good school attendance so important?

- All children have a right to an education and the legal responsibility to provide children with an education lies with their parents/carers.
- When children are absent from school, whatever the cause, this disrupts their learning and can have a significant impact on their future life opportunities.
- In particular, poor attendance can affect attainment levels, relationships with peers, wellbeing and emotional resilience.

Being at school on time each day is also crucial to your child's progress and learning. Did you know that being 15 minutes late every day, will result in your child missing approximately 50 hours of teaching per year? We understand that everyone can on occasion run late. However, regular lateness can have a serious impact on children's learning and wellbeing, and we greatly encourage everyone to try their best to be at school on time for the bell ringing at 9:00am to ensure your child can make the most of their education.

School Improvement

Nursery Update

April has been a quick month within our nursery! This month's 'Rhyme of the Month' is the 'Rainbow Song' and our 'Book of the Month' is 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We are continuing to issue our 'SIMOA' home-school link bag to encourage our children to risk assess and think about their own safety. Please let us know what you think about the various home-link resources by either filling in the feedback forms provided and encouraging your child to draw a picture or by emailing a photograph to <u>gw14lochpsoffice@glow.sch.uk</u>. We kindly ask that you return the bags after your allocated time so that the bags can be issued to the next child in the group.

This month the 'Tiny Talking Team' have discussed what songs they would like to perform at our Graduation show and all of the children will be included by voting for their favourites. Rehearsals will be starting soon!

This term, our children who will be moving on to primary school in August will be focusing on getting ready for their transition to school. For children who will be attending Loch PS in August, this will include some joint events with children from Springlaw Nursery who will also be attending Loch PS. These events will include:

- A playtime visit to see and explore the playground on 30th April 2025.
- A joint assembly with Miss Simpson (HT) in our assembly hall on 8th May 2025.

These joint events will provide the children with opportunities to build friendships and support their transition to school.

Within the nursery, we will also be using the story, 'The Colour Monster Goes to School', to help all of our pre-schoolers to explore their feelings about starting school. Each preschooler will have the opportunity to take a bookbag home for a week and we encourage you to explore this story and the resources to support and prepare your child for their transition.

Parental Engagement Week begins w/c 12th May 2025 and Mrs McKee will be holding one of her fun BookBug sessions on Thursday 15th May 2025. If you wish to come along, a signup sheet will be available in the cloakroom and we encourage you to join in this excellent event!

Our Forest Adventures sessions are finished for this year. If your child has not yet attended a session, these will resume in September. In the meantime, we will be organising a couple of 'Forest Adventures - A Walk in the Woods' sessions for you to come along to with your child. These will be themed on our 'Book of the Month', 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. A poster will be put up in the cloakroom soon. Please sign up if you wish to attend.

With the weather changing and with hopefully more sun, we kindly ask you to apply sun cream to your child prior to arrival to nursery and to provide your child with sun cream that staff can reapply throughout the day. Each child should have their own sun cream, and these will be stored in their individual peg bags or the suncream basket in the cloakroom. As the children are outdoors each day, it is important to ensure they remain safe in the sun! We also kindly ask that you provide a change of clothes for your child if possible, in case of emergency, and that any borrowed items are returned to the nursery as soon as possible. Donations of clothes that your child has outgrown would be greatly appreciated for our preloved rail which is available in the cloakroom to encourage recycling and sustainability.

Please note that the nursery day finishes at 3:00pm and all children must be collected by this time. If for any reason you are running late, please contact the school office on 0141 634 7217 to advise of this.

Health and Safety 😲

As we have children in the nursery and school with severe allergies, please remember that Loch Primary School and Nursery Class is a 'NUT FREE' school. Please keep this in mind when you are sending your child to school/nursery with a snack/packed lunch.

During Breakfast Club drop-off, we kindly ask parents/carers to make use of the top car park as you enter the school grounds and to refrain from coming down to the staff car park or beyond the zebra crossing that leads to our Breakfast Club entrance. This is to ensure the health and safety of our children as this must be a safe route for them to walk and cross to enter the school building. We also kindly ask parents/carers to be mindful of their speed when driving within the school grounds/ nearby areas and to be mindful of children crossing. We continue to promote road safety in school, and we greatly appreciate your support in ensuring the safety of all of our children.
