Staffing Update ''

I have been asked by South Lanarkshire Council (SLC) to support at another primary school within SLC over the next few weeks in the absence of their Head Teacher. I will continue to work between both schools and will be in regular contact with Mrs Munro. This will be a seamless transition for the children and I look forward to being back at Loch PS full time soon.

Attendance and Time-Keeping

Attendance at school remains a key priority here at Loch Primary School and across the Cathkin Learning Community. Attendance is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Your child's attendance rate has a significant impact on their attainment and achievements. Did you know, within a full school year the following percentages show you the number of days lost learning:

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95% - 99%	Up to 10 days absence (2
	weeks)
90% - 94%	Up to 20 days absence (4
	weeks)
85% - 89%	Up to 30 days absence (6
	weeks)
80% - 84%	Up to 38 days absence $(7\frac{1}{2})$
	weeks)
Less than 80%	More than 39 days absence

Above 95% Well Done 95% or less Slight Concern 90% or less Concerning 85% or less Risk of Underachievement This is the same as missing 9 school days: nearly 2 weeks! Right to an Education (Article 28)

Why is good school attendance so important?

- All children have a right to an education and the legal responsibility to provide children with an education lies with their parents/carers.
- When children are absent from school, whatever the cause, this disrupts their learning and can have a significant impact on their future life opportunities.
- In particular, poor attendance can affect attainment levels, relationships with peers, wellbeing and emotional resilience.

Top Tips for Parents/Carers to Promote Good Attendance:

- Be on time for school, even missing 10 minutes every day adds up and can negatively impact learning.
- Always let the school know before 9.30am if your child won't be in and what the reason for the absence is.
- Keep in regular contact with the school for the duration of the absence.
- Only keep your child at home for the minimum time possible reducing the number of days of lost learning.
- Avoid booking holidays during term time.
- Have positive conversations about school with your child to encourage positive mindsets.
- Be involved in school life and your child's learning journey.

We understand that everyone can on occasion run late. However, regular lateness can have a serious impact on children's learning and wellbeing, and we greatly encourage everyone to try their best to be at school on time for the bell ringing at 9:00am to ensure your child can make the most of their education.

Nursery Update



This month we have been delighted to welcome all of our new starts who are settling in well and enjoying exploring our nursery! The children have been busy focusing on developing their sharing and turn taking skills in all areas of the nursery. We have also been learning about each other's families and learning about the seasons by preparing our planters for the winter. The children have been enjoying learning outside in our nursery garden in all weathers and have access to sand and water play every day. We kindly ask that children wear appropriate clothing for the colder weather to allow them to continue to enjoy the outdoors and that you provide a change of clothing and indoor shoes in case they get wet or dirty to allow for easy changing.

This month we are delighted to see the return of our 'Rhyme of the Month' and 'Book of the Month' initiatives to further develop our children's Literacy skills. Each month we will focus on a book and a rhyme within the nursery. Activities will be sent home along with the home-link learning book bags which will contain a copy of the story along with linked games. Please note that these must be returned after a week to allow all children in the nursery to have a turn at taking the bag home. This month our book has been 'Little Red Riding Hood' and our rhyme has been 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes'. We would love to hear about our children's wonderful home learning. We would greatly appreciate if you could complete the feedback forms and email/provide photos which we will add to our display walls and the children's Learning Journals.

We have also been excited to see the return of our 'Forest Adventures' programme this month. Over the session, each child will participate in this programme, providing them with the opportunity to develop their learning and skills in the outdoors. This will include assessing and managing risk, working with a team, exploring and learning about nature and developing their communication and social skills.

SIMOA is a Care Inspectorate initiative based to raise awareness and act responsibly to safeguard, protect and support children's wellbeing. We use 'SIMOA' the elephant plushie and various activities and stories to encourage the children to explore and focus on themes about keeping ourselves safe within the nursery and at home. Each day the children help to risk assess the nursery and our outdoor area. It is important that children can't leave an area without staff or parents/carers. Therefore, we would appreciate when exiting the nursery, that you could discourage the children from pressing the green exit buttons to ensure their safety at all times.
