Attendance and Punctuality



Attendance at school remains a key priority here at Loch Primary School and across the Cathkin Learning Community. Attendance is crucial to supporting children's progress, wellbeing and attainment. Your child's attendance rate has a significant impact on their attainment and achievements. Did you know, within a full school year the following percentages show you the number of days lost learning:

| 95% - 99% | Up to 10 days absence (2 weeks) |
|-----------|----------------------------------|
| 90% - 94% | Up to 20 days absence (4 weeks) |
| 85% - 89% | Up to 30 days absence (6 weeks) |
| 80% - 84% | Up to 38 days absence (7½ weeks) |
| Less than | More than 39 days |
| 80% | absence |

Being at school on time each day is also crucial to your child's progress and learning. Did you know that being 15 minutes late every day, will result in your child missing approximately 50 hours of teaching per year? We greatly encourage everyone to try their best to be at school on time for the bell ringing at 9:00am to ensure your child can make the most of their education.

SLC Health and Wellbeing Survey for P5-P7 Children



South Lanarkshire Council is planning to undertake a Health and Wellbeing (HWB) survey for children in November and December 2025. SLC are conducting this survey to get to know more about the HWB of children in SLC. The aim of the survey is to allow SLC to:

- Collect information about the HWB of children across SLC.
- Ensure children's voices and experiences are taken into account when planning future changes.
- Give Head Teachers information to improve the HWB support they give to children.
- Make sure our services are meeting the needs of children and young people.
 SLC are asking children and young people from P5 to S6 to take part in the survey. This will help us to make sure their voices are heard.
 To allow your child to participate, parents/carers of P5, P6 and P7 pupils should sign the consent form via Parents Portal or the paper copy provided. The surveys will commence in classes w/c Monday 4th
